aving been born into a family with many creative ancestors, I think I was destined to spend my life encouraging others to discover creativity by working with children and adults.

Since childhood, I have had a vital interest in the visual arts. My creative mother was very



supportive by providing me with supplies, art classes, and exposure to art by attending exhibitions and museums. Because of her, I was doing pastel portraits as a teenager.

Subsequently, I won many accolades at school and in our community for my abilities to draw and to be creative.

My need to create has changed directions over the years. It began with a strong interest in representational drawings and then moved to the desire to experiment with all kinds of new media and materials in a more abstract design. As a teacher, this activity became a real stimulant for inspiring my students to try new methods of expressions.

For over 20 years I studied with many seasoned artists around the United States in order to broaden my knowledge of art. This was invaluable to my success in being recognized regionally and nationally in the art world.

Much of that experience was gained by painting with other artists who were equally passionate about creating art. My artist friends and I often had many discussions on why we feel the need to continue to create

For a visual artist, the art we create is like a writer's composition or a dancer's interpretation through form. It's our way of communication and interpreting what we see, feel and love about our lives.

Even my love of gardening becomes a part of my creations. Images of abstract flowers have often been a part of my subject matter.

Another reason why I create involves the great pleasure that comes from seeing one's students create and later be recognized for their uniqueness, and knowing that you had some small part in that creative process.

Similarly, the simple act of helping an interested friend to understand an art object through one's explanation can be another rewarding experience. I have often become the art museum "tour guide" over the years, confirming the statement "once a teacher always a teacher."

In 2000, the former

Northwest Indiana Arts
Association, now Southshore
Arts, honored me with a 55-year
retrospective of my work,
which included over 90 pieces.
Twenty-five of those pieces
were borrowed from collectors
all over the United States. I was
very pleased that those who
viewed the exhibition could see
transitions of my interests and
the evolution of my methods of
expressions.

I plan to continue making new creations as long as I am physically able, because making art is a vital part of my existence. We who have this privileged are very lucky, for we should never be lonely when we have this continual urge to express our new ideas.

I believe everyone has some capacity to be creative. I highly recommend investigating the arts as a pleasurable activity that will enhance the quality of one's life in many unexpected way.
